HOST STATE REPORT

The 2014 School Sport Australia Football Championships were an outstanding success in all aspects, with all games being played in an excellent spirit despite the challenging weather conditions. Competitors and team management are to be congratulated on their co-operation and assistance during the week, both at the venues and in the surrounding communities. The standard of competition was extremely high with many favourable reports regarding the behaviour of the team members being received by the local organising committee.

Date and Venue

The 2014 School Sport Australia Football Championships were conducted from 24-29 August 2014 at Glenwood (NSW). The venues had two (international) full sized synthetic fields available for competition as well as ample warm up areas. The venues provided excellent amenities for all facets of the championship.

Teams Competing

The championships featured representation from the following states and territories: - Queensland (Boys and Girls), New South Wales (Boys and Girls), Australian Capital Territory (Boys and Girls), Victoria (Boys and Girls), South Australia (Boys and Girls) and Western Australia (Boys and Girls).

Congratulations are extended to the 2014 winners; New South Wales in the girls and New South Wales in the boys.
