#### MR. RD. QUIMBY




MR. R. D. QUIMBY President

Degen as Chairman, Bob organised the first Schools meeting for the establishment of the Australian Schools Soccer Federation, At the meeting were Denis Adrigan (then President of Australian Coaches Federation), Bill Vrolyks (then President of N.S. W. Coaches Federation) and Mr. J. Dodd, C. H. S. Convener

It was perhaps interesting to note that the Schools Organisations then and now sought close association with coaches and referee bodies. This meeting outlined the problems of the geographic isolation as the major problem.

During 1973, Bob Quimby actively promoted the idea amongst the State Government school organisations. In a meeting of State Government soccer convenors, the support of Bob's plan to involve all schools was accepted.






