Last year was the first time N.N.S.W. entered a side in the School National Championships. The result added fuel to the argument that this State produces some of the finest junior and schoolboy footballers in the country. Victoria ultimately defeated N.N.S.W. 2-0 in the final but to even reach the final at the first attempt was a great effort in itself. This year we have a side more than capable of going one better than last years by winning the championship.

There are several players in the present squad who were members of last years great side and should form a solid nucleus around which a winning side can be built. They include Merv Duff, Lloyd Hardes, Peter Newton, Steven Bryen and Paul Paulus.

This year there are four players from the Northern Rivers area of the State and indicate the increasing depth of players outside the Newcastle area. They are S. Bryen, Tony Roder, Shane Wilson and Stephen Perrin. It is expected that in future years even more players from outside of Newcastle will work their way into the State team, they will include players from private schools as well.

The new members of this years side see a strong contingent of skilful ball players like Craig Johnston, Brett Cowburn, Ross Lawrence and Chris McKay. The remaining members of the squad are all strong resourceful players and they are Peter Beach, David Gray, Neville Hamilton and Ken Standen.

The side has the right mixture of strength, excellent ball skill, determination and thus avenge last years loss and we in the North are quite confident they will do it.

Mr. R.D. (Bob) Quimby President of the Australian Schools Soccer Federation.

In 1972, with F. Degen as Chairman, Bob organised the first Schools meeting for the establishment of the Australian Schools Soccer Federation. At the meeting were Dennis Adrigan (then President of Australian Coaches Federation), Bill Vrolyks (then President of N.S.W. Coaches Federation) and Mr. J. Dodd, C.H.S. Convener.

It was perhaps interesting to note that the Schools Organisations then and now sought close association with coaches and referee bodies. This meeting outlined the problems of the geographic isolation as the major problem.

During 1973, Bob Quimby actively promoted the idea amongst the State Government school organisations. In a meeting of State Government soccer convenors, the support of Bob's plan to involve all schools was accepted.

Since then the Federation has gone from strength to strength. Today it is the largest Schools team sport in Australia.



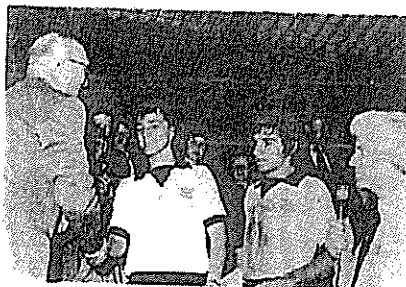
